

How Does It Work?



1. Submit an application.
2. If you meet income and credit guidelines, you will attend an information meeting and fill out a full-length application.
3. A member of Habitat for Humanity of Hamilton County will do a home visit to verify your need for housing. Need for housing can include overcrowding, leaky roof, high rent and dangerous electrical wiring.
4. If approved, you will attend an orientation and start earning your 300-500 hours of "sweat equity." To earn hours, you attend weekly budget classes, participate in homeowner education classes like construction, home maintenance, and financial planning and management.
5. Once you've started earning your "sweat equity" hours, you'll be assigned a lot among those where we plan to build.
6. After selecting your lot, you will work alongside Habitat for Humanity of Hamilton County volunteers to build your own home.
7. Once completed, Habitat for Humanity of Hamilton County will work with you and your Covenant Partner to bless your home at a dedication ceremony.
8. Your home will be deeded to you and you become a homeowner.

Habitat for Humanity of Hamilton County is a nonprofit, ecumenical Christian organization that works in partnership with families in Hamilton County to build simple, decent, and affordable homes with those in need. The partner families contribute hundreds of hours of “sweat equity” in the construction of their home and the homes of others. Simply put, you pick up a hammer and get to work on building your home.

In addition to sweat equity, partner families must attend budget classes and monthly homeowner workshops. These classes and workshops help to prepare our partner families for the financial and other responsibilities that come with owning a home.



Homeowner Partnering Process

Habitat for Humanity of Hamilton County works with partner families throughout the partnering process—from the initial assessment to a blessing ceremony when they receive the deed to their home.

Do I Qualify?

If the following conditions apply to you, then you may begin the partnering process:

- Is your current housing not meeting your needs?
- Can you make a monthly payment for your home?
- Are you willing to volunteer to help build your own home?
